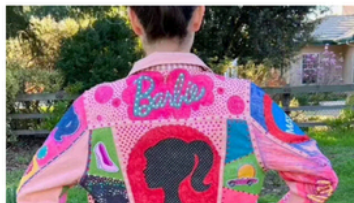

Despite my past sins and shame, God called me to serve again. I joined the iGive Club, Media Ministry, Warmth Ministry, Music Ministry, and the small groups.

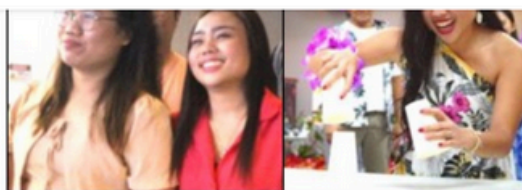
I learned how to smile, laugh, and enjoy life once again.

"Hey, here I am. I see you. I love you—even in your worst, even in your messiest. So cheer up, My child. I'm with you."

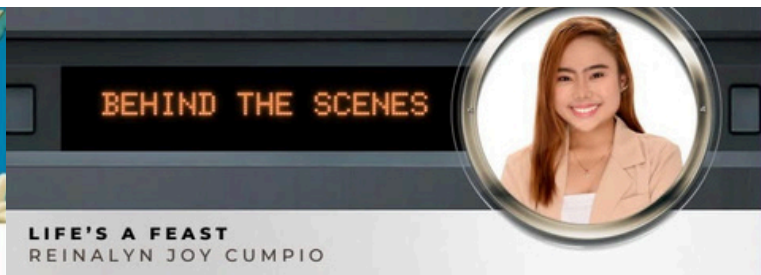
Have you ever had someone appreciate you when you least expect it? People you barely know—cheering for you, showing kindness that feels almost unearned? It's easy to brush it off, especially when you don't believe in yourself or see your own worth.

But what if that's exactly how God works?

If strangers can see something beautiful in you, how much more does the God who formed you, who knows you inside and out, see? Even when you don't feel Him, He is there. Watching. Loving. Guiding.

He is the faithful God who never forgets, never forsakes. He remembers every prayer, every tear, every hidden dream. And He will do whatever it takes to bring you to the place of victory—your purpose, your calling, and ultimately, His loving arms.

I even questioned my worthiness to serve, especially knowing that my niece and nephew were born out of teenage pregnancies. How could I bring Jesus to others when I couldn't even bring Him fully into my own home?

Still, it remained my long-term prayer: "Lord, one day, may I serve alongside my whole family." In recent months, however, I found myself serving more and bonding less with them. I had just adopted three puppies, caring for them in my apartment. During our Singles Shelter Retreat, I was anxious about leaving them behind. I asked my sister if someone from the family could drop by to feed and check on them. But I didn't expect much—she had already expressed hesitation, afraid the dogs might bite them since they weren't familiar. With no signal at the retreat, I couldn't follow up. All I could do was pray that my puppies would be okay.

Then came the surprise: as I was heading home, my sister messaged me, saying they brought home the puppies. When I came home, I was stunned. The dogs had been well cared for—they were even wearing diapers, treated like little babies! At that moment, I felt God whisper: "I've been here all along."

Sometimes, we think God only answers when our big dreams come true. I was so focused on wanting to serve with my family that I almost missed how they've been serving with me, in quiet ways—by showing up, supporting me, and stepping in when I needed help the most. They loved and served without asking for my recognition. That is Jesus, alive in my family. And God, in His perfect timing, keeps planting seeds.

Just one Saturday night, before bed, my nephew—falling asleep said, "Tomorrow, I will go serve." He even turned down an invitation from his cousins to play, choosing instead to go to church. My heart melted. This was a prayer answered, even just in part.

Not in my timing, but in God's. I know this journey is far from over. God is still writing the story. But I've learned that when you surrender everything to Him—your pain, your prayers, your family, your ministry—He moves in ways you don't expect. And He never forgets.

He sees you. He's working, even behind the scenes.

I play Mobile Legends, a game where two teams of five battle real time. When the match becomes difficult and victory seems impossible, the team has the option to surrender by voting to forfeit the game. In the thousands of matches I've played, I can count on one hand the number of times I initiated a surrender vote. Why? Because I firmly believe, "Habang may buhay, may pag-asa." (While there is life, there is hope.)

This belief extends beyond gaming—it shapes how I approach real life. When it comes to the things I desire most, I refuse to give up easily. I pray persistently, trusting in God's power to make a way. But lately, I've wrestled with a difficult question: *Should I keep praying, or is it time to surrender?*

During the Feast Conference 2024, Fr. Francis Gustillo spoke words that struck my heart. He said, "You actually surrender to God when you stop thinking about it and praying for it."

For months, I tried to surrender—I stopped thinking about it, stopped praying for it. But instead of peace, I felt lost and burdened. Each morning, I woke up hoping for a new day filled with joy and renewed purpose, only to find myself still waiting.

In my struggle, I cried out to God, "Give me the courage to face each day with strength. Help me stand up and walk forward again. Remind me, Lord, that my life is not about achievements but about fulfilling the mission You have called me to."

In that moment, I realized that surrendering doesn't mean giving up. It doesn't mean passively waiting for God to act while we do nothing. Surrender means doing our part with excellence and entrusting the outcome to God. It means releasing control and believing that whatever happens, His plan is always greater.

Surrender isn't about stopping; it's about trusting. It's about faithfully walking the path God has set before us, knowing He will fulfill the desires He has planted in our hearts at the right time. He is with us in every season, in every struggle, even in the messiness of life. He has never forgotten us, and He never will.

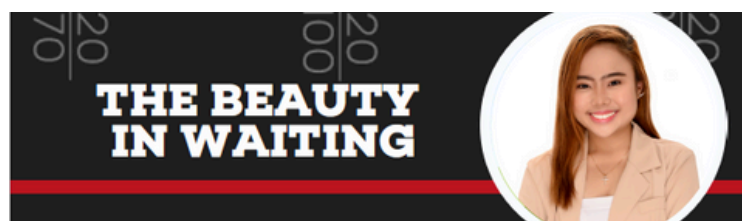
Now, instead of asking myself, "What am I doing for the Lord?" I've begun to ask, "How am I receiving from the Lord?"

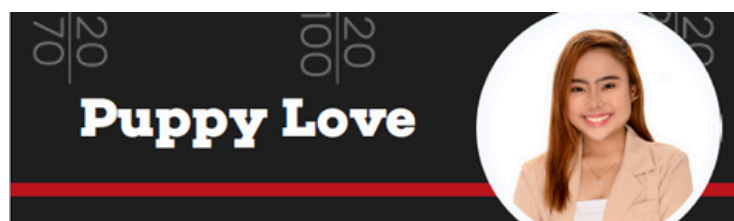

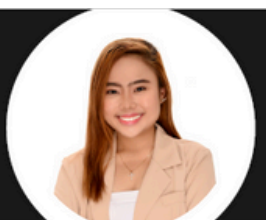

The process is messy and painful, but He's molding me so I have the capacity to hold the big blessings He has for me. Otherwise, they might slip through my hands and be wasted.

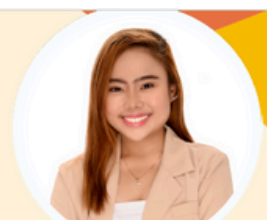

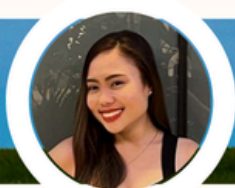

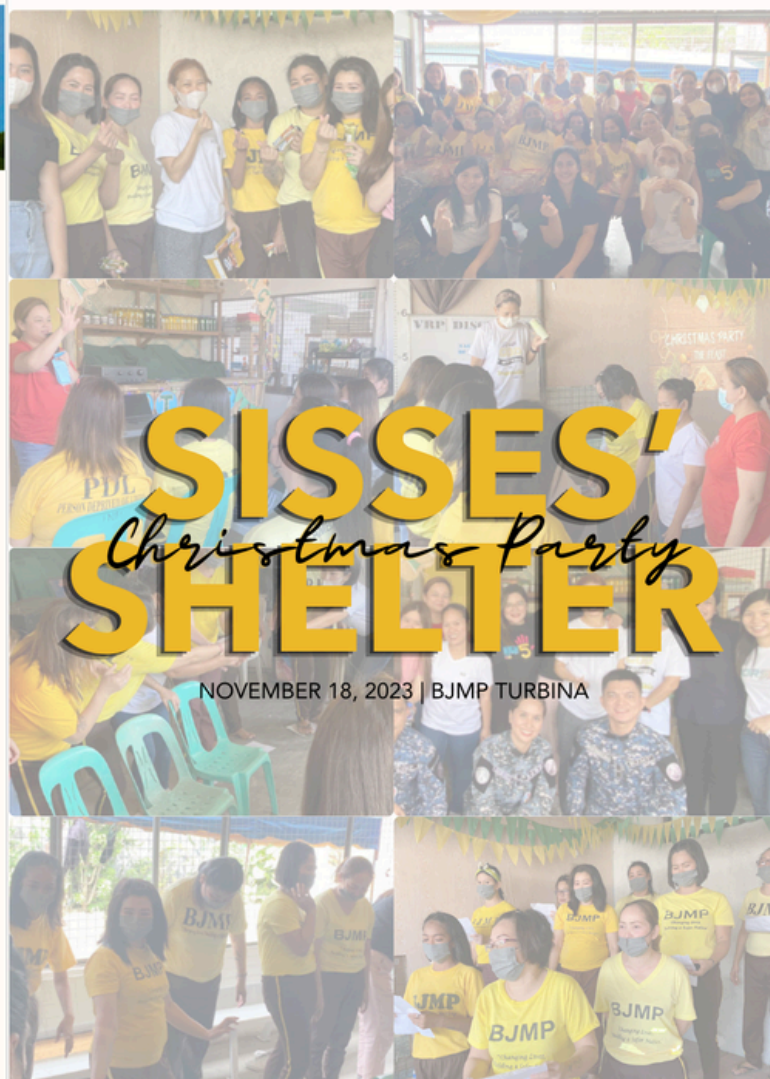
I'll be honest; supporting the Prison Mission of Feast Calamba was a challenge due to my upbringing and rigid views on handling mistakes. My high expectations for both myself and others made accepting failure difficult.

Last August, questioning my worthiness in ministry, I withdrew from my service, feeling undeserving. However, in late September, I came across Romans 8:1 again, and it resonated with me: "There's no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus."

In October, upon returning to The Feast, I attempted to hide due to shame. Unexpectedly, someone I was avoiding greeted me warmly, triggering a realization. I excessively condemned myself for mistakes, yet God eagerly welcomes me back when I stray. This encounter shifted my outlook on accepting mistakes and understanding our brethren in prison.

On November 18, our all-women small group called Sisses Shelter spent our Christmas party at the Bureau of Jail Management and Penology in Turbina. I had the privilege of serving our sisters in prison, and it was a humbling experience. I came to understand that there are no big or small sins in God's eyes. Comparing my sins to others became senseless, as, at the end of the day, we all have one God who forgives us, regardless of our perceptions of sin size. It is not for me to condemn myself or others because only God can judge us; only He sees our hearts. Forgiveness and favor come from God's grace alone. His salvation is available to everyone who calls on His name.

Realizing that forgiveness and redemption stem solely from God, I aim to share this Gospel of hope with anyone striving to lead a righteous life. God offers a fresh start to all, being merciful and generous to those seeking healing and forgiveness.

This year is one of the most challenging years for me. I've been a freelance Virtual Assistant for almost two years and I thought I am ready with any uncertainty. I started the year ending my two year project hoping I am landing a better career path for me. As the first quarter was ending, that new project has also ended without any hints in advance. I was confident that it would not be hard for me to ace new clients. I have a competitive background, know how to sell myself, and what I bring to the table. Truly enough, I wasn't vacant with projects but I got low paying clients and often gave me headaches because we are not aligned with some ideals so I have to let them go.

The second quarter has passed, and I'm still having a hard time finding stable projects. I came to the point of questioning myself with this career path so I tried to apply in academic institutions as a College Instructor. One month later, I was hired. Ironically, after two weeks, a friend approached me for a new project. I didn't expect that I would be hired. I thought I could manage to work two jobs but after a month, I quit my night job because I wanted to focus full time on teaching.

The third quarter came and I started to lose heart with my teaching job. I am praying about quitting and every time I do that God is funny to quickly answer me. I will receive interview invitations to the job postings I didn't apply for but I was not sure if I would get back to freelance work again because I started to enjoy teaching. I wanted to think of it as a test of faith to remain firm in serving the youth in school. But still I kept on praying for God to enlighten me, and on the third time I tried to accept an invitation. After three days, I got a new project which I believed God answered my prayer to align me to the company with the same values in moral and financial.

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Points to Ponder

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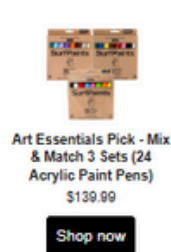
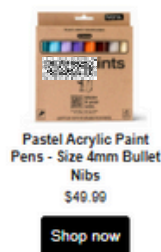
2. We'd love to know how you came across **SurfPaints**. What aspects of **SurfPaints** do you find most appealing or inspiring for your art?
